#### French/ Literacy

Remember to also use a dictionary or an online tool to help you with unknown words in French.

You are responsible for choosing your topic. Here are a couple of ideas:

- 1) Quelque chose que tu as fait à la maison. Something you've done while at home.
- 2) Qu'est-ce qui te manque à l'école? Pourquoi? What do you miss about school? Why?
- 3) Parlez-moi d'une activité que vous aimez faire avec votre famille pendant la fin de semaine. Tell me about an activity you like to do with your family (mom, dad, or siblings) on the weekend.
- 4) Qu'aimeriez-vous faire cet été? What would you like to do this Summer?
- 5) **Votre chose préférée à faire avec votre animal de compagnie.** Your favorite thing to do with your pet.



### Mathématiques / Math

For math this week, we are going to begin multiplying larger numbers. Students will use their knowledge of their base ten units as a visual to help them understand the process when multiplying 2-digit numbers.

Base ten:

Unité = 1 Dizaine= 10 Centaine= 100



**Example: 3x10=?** 


The 3 in this equation represents that there are **3 groups of 10.** 10+10+10=30.

1 2 3

The 10 represents how many are in each group.

An explanation of this is on page 278 and 279 of the attachments on the **home learning teacher page.** 

Students will complete the activities **1 to 7 on page 280.** Using their base ten knowledge, they can draw out base ten blocks to help them solve each answer.



<u>Optional:</u> If students want to go farther, they could try questions 8 to 12 on page 279 & 281. They are written problems of multiplication. These pages are attached on the home learning teacher page.

### <u>Science Humaines / Social Studies</u>

We have been learning about exploring our world. This week, we are going to learn about our climate. I ask students to do the following:

- 1) Watch the following video <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=cHOCvixin-E">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=cHOCvixin-E</a> approx. 2.5 minutes long. (The language in the video is advanced for most students, but the imagery should help them to understand).
- 2) Then, students should ask themselves the following questions:
- a) Qu'est-ce qu'un climat? What is a climate?
- b) Comment les humains affectent-ils notre climat? How are humans affecting our climate?
- c) **Nommez une façon dont nous pouvons aider notre climat**. Name one way we can help our climate.
