<p>Go on a scavenger hunt around your yard. Can you find: a bug, a bike, a bird, a bird's nest, a tree, a rock, a leaf...</p>	<p>Make a pledge and a plan to take action! Write down two actions you will take on to protect our Earth!</p> 	<p>Go for a walk or hang out in your yard and try to find as many living and nonliving things as possible. Bring a notebook and pencil with you. Draw and label what you find.</p>	<p>Create the life cycle of an animal, an insect or a plant of your choice. (use chalk, crayons, construction paper, etc. Be creative!)</p>
<p>What can you make using recyclable items in your house? (example: empty toilet paper roll? Egg cartons, water bottles, old clothes, etc.)</p>	<p>How big is your favorite tree? Pick a tree in your yard and use an item around the house to measure it. How many different measures can you make? (example: use string to measure the height, width, around, etc.)</p>	<p>Create a math flower. Choose a number between 1- 100. Use each petal on the flower to show a different way to represent that number. Use tally marks, words, ten frames, addition or subtraction sentences, dices, etc.</p>	<p>Think about ways you can protect the environment by recycling, reusing and reducing the waste we create. <i>Create a picture poster to highlight one way you can protect the earth.</i></p>
<p>Challenge your family members to participate in a "one hour with no power" during your day.</p>	<p>Make a video or presentation urging others to take action. Send it to your teacher and family members.</p>	<p>Pick up trash around your yard. Make a graph using the items you found. How many of each did you find? How many items in total? Create three different addition problems with these numbers.</p>	<p>Make signs around the house. Sometimes we just need a little reminder to help us change our habits.</p>
